Chinese culture evolved over thousands of years into one of the oldest and complex in the history of human civilization. The resurgence of the People's Republic of China as a world power has created a renaissance of this ancient culture around the globe. While China's geography and ethnic groups have changed drastically since 2500 BC, when ancient China was ruled by a group of semi-mythological rulers and culture heroes. In myth, early China was ruled by demigods—exemplary sages possessed of great moral character—who used their powers to help create mankind itself and impart essential skills and knowledge to humanity.

Our guest speaker, Mr. Nan Su, grew up in China and came to the United States in the year 2000 and began to write in Chinese and publish poems, short stories, and prose. Since 2003 he has been a news commentator for

international Chinese radio and television networks. Besides his involvement in the public, Mr. Su has a master degree in engineering and has been a professional engineer for over 20 years. He lives in San Jose with his wife and two daughters.
