

Fellow Rotarian Jose Octavio Guillen began a difficult journey as a 14 year old boy when he and his family emigrated from Guatemala to the America of riches, opportunities, and success. After years of hard work and struggle to adjust to the American language and culture, he began his career of professional accomplishments in county administration, first in smaller cities, then Metropolitan Los Angeles, and here in the North Bay in late 2009 when our Sonoma County judges appointed Jose as Executive Officer and Jury Commissioner for the Superior Court of Sonoma County, overseeing the 230 employee court system and a \$34 million budget. Except for those employees, plus some attorneys and other professional lawbreakers, most citizens have no clue about this system of justice. Next Wednesday, Jose combines his personal story with his expertise as manager and administrator as the chief executive for the Sonoma County Superior Court to give us an insider's view of the nuts, bolts and challenges of this unique field.

PROGRAM

Fellow Rotarian Jean Irwin gave a delightful talk about literacy issues at home and around the world was an Ambassadorial Scholar years ago in England, Jean discussed the research of providing literacy programs to the deaf and talked about her experiences living abroad and the unique cultures of literacy in other countries. Jean emphasized to everyone the very important message regarding how critical it is to read to our children, and to have our children read to us.

Jean shared some insights into teaching reading to deaf children. Something this writer didn't know is that those who are unable to hear actually do hear muffled sounds, not total silence. This is why when they learn to talk, the deaf speak in a distinctive, somewhat muffled style. Jean shared

her experience that while the blind can be taught to read Braille at a high level, the deaf ordinarily achieve only about a fourth grade reading level.

Jean enlightened all the Rotarians and guests this evening on the importance of reading in the education of all children. She again emphasized the importance of reading to children and also having them read to you.

SIGN UP: HELP A CHILD READ!

The Volunteer Center's Barbara Fisher told the Rotarian attendees about **Schools of Hope**—a tutoring program sponsored by the United Way with lots of support from the Volunteer Center. She encouraged us all to join in this effort to help young people learn to read. **Casey D'Angelo** emphasized that Schools of Hope is a local hands-on literacy project right here in Santa Rosa and urged interested Rotarians to volunteer to work one hour a week with first grade students and help them learn to read. Herb Salinger took the stand for a brief moment to talk about literacy and to thank all the clubs for coming together this evening. After circulating around the Flamingo Ballroom, the baskets came back filled to the brim with \$541 that will be donated to for Jean Irwin and her Reno Rotary Club's literacy program. **Craig Meltzner** concluded the meeting by bringing the Santa Rosa Rotary Club members and guests to their feet to recite Rotary's 4-Way Test.
