



CORPORATE ROTARY MEMBERSHIPS

The boards of directors, at last week's meeting, voted unanimously to have the Rotary Club of Santa Rosa apply to be part of a three-year Rotary International Pilot Program to allow corporate Rotary memberships to be extended to business organizations. This resolution will be brought before the membership at the regular noon meeting on Feb. 16th. A two-thirds vote is required. The proposal would allow the organization to designate up to four people who would attend club meetings and participate in all club activities. The organization would pay membership dues to RI with all other club dues, fees, meal costs, etc. to be set by the individual club. A corporate designee would be permitted to convert from their corporate status to an individual membership in the club. The Board feels that this is an excellent way to grow the membership of our

club and reach out to major businesses in our area whose employees, officers, etc., may not have the time during their business day to attend our meetings on a regular basis. More information is available at the RI website under "Pilot Programs".
