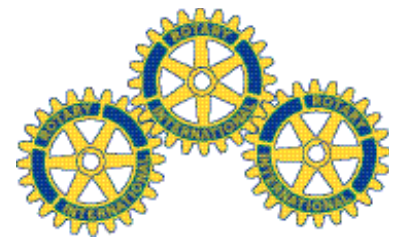

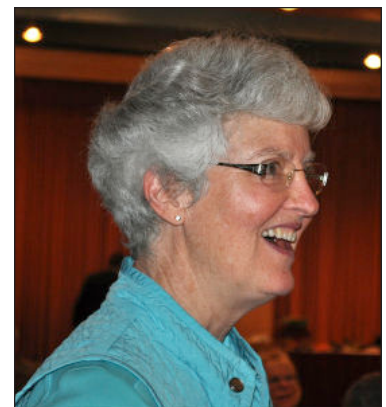


Kim Murphy heads to Indiana to serve tornado victims
