


OUR PROGRAM FOR MAY 9TH:

Our fellow Rotarian, and next week's speaker, Dr. Barry Silberg established his medical practice in Santa Rosa more than 30 years ago. He has not slowed down yet. He received his medical degree from the University of Texas, served in Europe for three years—Major Silberg in the U.S. Army Medical Corps—and then trained as a general surgeon under renowned heart surgeon Michael DeBakey at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. A foremost plastic surgeon known for his surgical skills, he is recognized for his work in reconstructive surgery. He recently received

approval to conduct Phase 2 studies of his latest

medical innovation to treat soft tissue infections to treat diabetics with severe lower leg infections—the focus of next Wednesday's presentation to Rotary.

Stock up on good maps because directions and road signs in some countries are difficult to read, although asking the locals for help can add to your cultural experience. He suggested taking it easy on the road to leave you with enthusiasm at day's end. About 40 miles a day leaves plenty of time for sightseeing and relaxing.
