


#### **Sonoma County Sister Cities in Ukraine**

## Russians seize dozens of towns

UKRAINE » Fighting in east intensifies; general pushes for broader war

Ukrainian officials acknowledged Friday that Russian forces had taken more than three dozen small towns in their initial drive this week to seize eastern Ukraine, offering the first

glimpse of what promises to be a grinding brawl by the Kremlin to achieve broader territorial gains in a new phase of the 2-month-old war.

The fighting in the east—along increasingly fortified lines that stretch across more than 300 miles—intensified as a Russian commander signaled even wider ambitions, warning that the Kremlin's forces aimed to take "full control" of southern Ukraine all the way to Moldova, Ukraine's southwest neighbor.

While it seemed unlikely that the commander, Gen. Rustam Minnekayev, would have misspoken, his warning still drew skepticism, based on Russia's probable difficulty in starting another broad offensive and the general's relatively obscure role in the hierarchy. But his threat could not be ruled out.

The broader war aims that he outlined at a defense industry meeting in a Russian city more

### Neighbors help Ukrainians in Poland

or 30 years, neighbors David Schneider and John Namkung have talked over the fence in their quiet, shady Lone Pine Village neighborhood on the south end of Sebastopol. They've celebrated kids' birthdays, nodded when taking out the recycling and warily eyed wildfire smoke together.

Their interaction April 8 was a little different. That day, Namkung took his old acquaintance to the Medyka border crossing, on the Polish side of its border with Ukraine, and showed him around the Korczowa refugee reception center, a converted shopping mall that has been serving as a temporary haven for thousands of people fleeing the Russian invasion.

This was Schneider's first day in Poland, and one of Namkung's last. Between them, the two retirees — Schneider, 71, is a psychologist; Namkung, 74, was director of special education for Santa Rosa City Schools — would spend nearly a month on the outskirts of a war, ferrying beleaguered families to safety.


